







It is possible to travel back in time, and it happens during a visit at the National Railway Museum of Pietrarsa. A more than 180-year journey, between locomotives, trains and carriages, which connected Italy from 1839 to the present day. Past and present, from the first locomotive to the modern High Speed trains, create a fil rouge that bands together the history of our Railways with the history of our Country. An exposition place, nationally unmatched in its field, and one of the most fascinating railway museums of Europe. Located between Naples and Portici, right on the first railway line of the country, laying between the sea and the Vesuvio, with a wonderful view on the Gulf of Naples. The historical structure is hosted in one of the most important industrial archeological sites of Italy: the Royal Mechanic, Pyrotechnic and Locomotives Factory, established in 1842 by Ferdinand II of Bourbon. The museum was open in 1839 and expands on a 36.000 m² area, 14.000 of which are covered. A perfect venue for a large variety of events and one of the biggest Meetings and Events Centre of Southern Italy, capable to host up to 2.500 people. The architechtural and environmental characteristics of the area make Pietrarsa a perfect place with the historical rolling stock as scenary. Societies, big companies and privates have the possibility to rent one or more spaces of the Museum, making their event also the occasion to revive an important chapter of the italian history.





The Pavilion of the Steam Locomotives, once dedicated to reparation and assembly activities, is the biggest and most fascinating one, with its ancient steam locomotives and its structure sustained by iron plinths, with a metal trusses roof. The locomotives, these giant artworks, are disposed on both sides and leave a large space in the centre of the hall, often used for important events and conventions, Gala dinner and fashion shows, realized with this unique scenography.






























Large pavilions connected by ancient arches, once the area dedicated to the forges. Today, here are exposed five diesel locomotives, among which there is the so called "sole".





















This Pavilion represents the beating heart of the ancient factory. Here there are some of the huge machines and tools used in the ancient workshops to curve the metal sheets or to hole the piston rods. The cinema hall is equipped with numerous seats and it was modernized with a dolby surround system and video ultra-HD system.






















The rooms, once used by the workers as diner, now direction offices, are closed to public, and they can be rented for different kind of events. The furnishings are characterized by ancient pieces, once used in the waiting lounges of the stations or in the offices of the Railway. The convention room was modernized and equipped with upholstered seats, a conference desk, surround system, and video projector.

The Library is the perfect space for small meetings or workshops, and it is equipped with a surround sound system, with the possibility of connection with the convention room of the area.
























The Pavilion of Carriages and Littorine, previously the boilers centre of the mechanic workshops, today hostes exemplars of locomotives from the first half of the 20th century. The real jewel of this pavilion is the precious Royal Carriage, part of a royal train, which then became property of the Presidence of the Republic. The ceiling is decoreted in pure gold, with crystal lamps made in Murano, the tapestry is in damask velvet, and the entire boiserie is in cherry wood. Also full of awesomeness and memories, is the "Centoporte" carriage, a convoy equipped with multiple doors, which allowed passengers to access directly to their seat.







This is the most ancient Pavilion of the Museum, built in 1842, known as «The Cathedral» because of the pointed arches that support the roof and give to the pavilion the solemnity of a gothic church. It hosts numerous railway models, among which we find the Bayard, the Settebello and the Arlecchino. Inside the hall there is also the famous plastic model «Trecentotreni», 18 metres long, and more than 2 metres large.


































With its perfect position in the middle of the museum area, the dining car "Vesuvio" gives to the events guests a privileged view directly over the Gulf of Naples.

The "Vesuvio" is equipped with wooden tables and upholstered chairs and benches, divided by a central aisle covered in elegant burgundy carpet, and gold outlines to delimitate the passage, the floor is ivory carpeted, abat-jour on each table, elegant fabric curtains, wood and glass for the dividing walls, a bar counter; the whole set makes the ambience bright and luxurious.

The wooden semi-circular bar counter is completely equipped for a high level catering service. The dining car "Vesuvio" was inspired by two models of restaurant cars, precisely 3rd class "popular restaurants". These two carriages were designed as dining cars for long distance trains destined to the "Dopolavoro" association journeys. On July 1939, the cars were employed for the first time on the line Rome – Bologna – Wien – Budapest.
















Inspired by the cloister of Santa Chiara, the elegant Caffè Bayard was realized with the most precious materials of the territory, with columns in Vietri ceramics, the bar counter in lava stone, and the exclusive lever coffee machine, a great example of the neapoletan refinement handcraft. 



Outside, in the courtyard that expands between the sea and the pavilions, there is a green area with a large amphitheatre used for outdoor events and concerts. Thanks to the collaboration with the Botanical Garden of Portici and the Agricultural Sciences Museum of the University Federico II of Naples, the whole area was requalified creating a Mediterranean Garden with plants from the five continents: Chile, South Africa, Australia, Mediterranean Basin and California.



















PLATFORM ROOF "FIORENZUOLA"




The ancient platform roof comes from Fiorenzuola D'Arda station, and it was made during the first years of the 20th century. It was realized in Liberty Style, typical of the period, in cast iron, like the statue of Ferdinand II of Bourbon, on the side, portrayed while proclaming the foundation of the Factory.






BY TRAIN

The FS railway station of the museum is Pietrarsa – S. Giorgio a Cremano and it is located next to the museum entrance. If you are coming from Napoli Centrale station, you need just to go to the Napoli Piazza Garibaldi underground station and find the platform of Trenitalia metro line 2. Trains to Salerno or Torre Annunziata Centrale/Castellammare stop at the museum.

The journey from the central station Napoli Piazza Garibaldi lasts 15 minutes.

HISTORICAL TRAIN

It is also possible to reach the National Railway Museum of Pietrarsa, on a special private occasion, living the experience of a journey on historical carriages "Centoporte" and "Corbellini" departing from Naples city centre. It is an historical train from the 1930s, and has a capacity of 400 seats. This train, called Pietrarsa Express, gives you the opportunity to make you guests live a very exclusive experience.

BY CAR

For visitors coming from highway A1 Rome-Naples: exit Naples city centre – Via Marittima, direction Portici, at the end of Via San Giovanni a Teduccio, turn on the right in Via Pietrarsa. For visitors coming from Salerno on highway A3: exit Portici – Ercolano, and follow the indication signs for the Museum.

BY TAXI

You can reach the museum also by taxi, directly from the central station, from the airport and from the main hotels of the city. The fare is established by the Municipality of Naples, considering that the museum is located inside the territory of the Municipality of Naples, and the fare is also indicated on the taximetre.

FOR DIFFERENTLY-ABLED AND REDUCED MOBILITY VISITORS

The Museum provides an easier access for all differently-abled visitors or people with reduced mobility. To access to the Museum, please give us a previous call at the number 081-472003 (option 1 or 2), to book a dedicated access from the gate, by a flat crossing, managed by the staff of the station. There is a reserved parking for the Museum's visitors, right in the same street, with a capacity of 200 autos.

The former Bourbonic Factory of Pietrarsa is located in the east side of the city of Naples, a few kilometres out of the city centre and easily reachable with the public transports, especially by the metropolitan service, and by car.

Choosing the National Railway Museum of Pietrarsa as the venue for an event can also become the occasion to increase your own knowledge about the surrounding territory of the city of Naples. This area is full of treasures to discover and places to explore.





The Royal Palace of Portici and MUSA centre

The Royal Palace of Portici, built in 1738 at the behest of Charles of Bourbon and his wife Amalia of Saxony, was one of the summer residences of the Bourbon royal family and its court. Located on the slopes of Vesuvius, it has an upper wood, originally dedicated to hunting, and a downstream wood, extended to the sea.

On October 3rd, 1839, the first railway line in Italy was inaugurated, connecting the Royal Palace to Naples.

The Royal Site of Portici, a museum centre, can be considered, in some way, a place of contrasts where the archaeological and scientific soul coexist.

The Park, upstream and downstream the Palace, preserves mediterranean green spaces, and nurseries of rare species of great interest for students.

The Archeological site of Ercolano

The Ruins of Ercolano preserve the rests of the ancient city of Ercolano, completely buried during the eruption of the Vesuvius in 79 AD, together with Pompei, Stabia and Oplonti.

The archeological investigations in Ercolano started in 1738: the major part of the evidences here founded are now hosted in the National Archeological Museum of Naples. In 2008 there was then the oppening of the Virtual Archeological Museum, which shows the city before the eruption of the Vesuvius. The site of Eroclano, in 1997, together with the ruins of Pompei and Oplonti, is part of the list of the UNESCO World Heritage.

Marine Turtle Research Centre – Zoological Station Anton Dohrn

The Marine Turtle Research Centre is equipped with advanced laboratories for environmental and biological analysis, a clinic with surgery and radiological rooms, a large didactic exposition, two multimedial rooms, together with all the spaces dedicated to the cure and rehabilitation of the marine turtles injured by the interation with the anthropic activities.

The visitors are welcome in the thematic acquarium room, dedicated to the descriptors of the environmental quality of the marine eco-systems, defined by the Marine Strategy of the European Commission. Then they meet the sea turtles and they have the possibility of observing them from the rehabilitation tubs.



The Vesuvio

The Vesuvio is located in the south-eastern part of the city of Naples, in the territory of the Vesuvius National Park, founded in 1995. With a 1.281 metres height, it is an unconventional beauty glance, framed by the Gulf panorama. A famous postcard image, taken from the Posillipo hill, definitively made the Vesuvio become part of the collective imagnation of the city of Naples.

The Golden Mile

The Golden Mile is a portion of the SS 18 Tirrenia Inferiore that goes from the fourth mile, under Villa De Bisogno in Casaluce, on Corso Resina, reaching Ercolano (next to the archeological site of Ercolano), and arrives to Palace Vallelonga, located in Torre del Greco. The mile was originally defined "golden" for its gardens full of orchands (oranges, lemons and tangerines). For its historical and panoramic wealth and its wonderful Vesuvian villas of the 18th century, it was considered as "golden" after the second half of the last century.

The Granatello Harbour

The origins of the former bourbon harbour are connected to its geological history. The name Granatello comes from an ancient plantation of pomegranate trees, which expanded on the entire coast until Piazza San Pasquale. Today there are only memories about it, but there isn't any trace about the plantation anymore; it got destroyed during the eruption of the Vesuvio in 1631.
